WASHINGTON, D.C. - Congressman Jerry Moran announced today that Levi Craghead of Alma is spending the spring semester of his junior year of high school serving as a Congressional Page for the U.S. House of Representatives in Washington D.C. Moran sponsored Levi to serve as a Congressional Page from January 26, 2009 to June 5, 2009.

"As a Page, Levi can learn firsthand about the role the House of Representatives has in lawmaking," Moran said. "Levi is getting the opportunity to work around actual congressional activities and is gaining experience that will help him understand the function of Congress and the impact it has on Kansas."

As a student at Wabaunsee High School, Levi is involved with 4-H Leadership; Future Business Leaders of America; Fellowship of Christian Athletes; and Family, Career, and Community Leaders of America. He serves as a People to People Student Ambassador to Europe; is a member of the National Honor Society; and is a Student Council Representative. He also plays baseball, football and basketball, among various other activities.

"The page program is an amazing experience," Levi said. "It is a lot of fun working as a page, and I have made lifelong friends that live all over the U.S. The most valuable thing that I am learning is how our government works and what a normal day is like on Capitol Hill."

The U.S. House of Representatives' Page Program allows high school juniors to assist with official House duties. As a Page, Levi delivers materials to Members' offices, prepares the House Floor for sessions and answers phones in the Members' Cloakroom. In addition to his duties as a page in the House of Representatives, Levi must also take high school classes throughout the program in core subjects such as math and English. Each Page is sponsored by a home-state Member of Congress.

Levi is the son of Galen and Linda Craghead and has two brothers, Logan and Luke, all from Alma.
