### Frequently Asked Questions

#### What do interns do?

- Interns perform a variety of tasks that are critical to the functioning of my congressional office. Interns assist with constituent requests, give Capitol tours, update databases, and perform basic clerical duties. Internships also provide students an opportunity to learn more about the legislative process and issues that are of special interest to them.

#### Do interns get paid?

- Interns receive a monthly stipend to help cover the costs of lodging, meals, and transportation.

#### Can I receive college credit?

- Yes. Depending on your academic program and requirements, interns may earn college credit. My office is happy to work with your academic advisors to ensure requirements are met.

How many interns are selected each session?

- Summer internships are the most competitive. The Summer session consists of two six-week terms. Students interested in interning in the summer generally serve one of the two six-week terms. The Spring and Fall sessions are less competitive and last much longer than the Summer session. Each session there are two positions available in my Washington, D.C. office and two positions available in my Kansas offices.

Do I have to be a political science major to apply?

- No. All students, regardless of academic background, that are interested in government and public service are encouraged to apply.

How do I apply?

- Submit by fax your completed application. This includes a letter detailing your interest in public service and describing your internship goals, a resume, college transcript, three letters of reference and a completed internship application form. Make sure you submit all of your materials before the deadline. Completed applications can be faxed to (202) 225-5124.

Does Congressman Moran's office provide housing?
